Decision makers need information on four important blocks

- 1. What is the country context?
- 2. What is the HRH status in the country?
- 3. Information about policy levers related to HRH
- 4. HWF practices and policies

1. What is the country context – health and health systems?

- Information on health status: health, demographic & socioeconomic indicators, burden of diseases and public health priorities
- Information on health systems: health infrastructure and service delivery, health system building blocks

2. What is the HRH status in the country?

- What are the HRH numbers and their distribution?
 - Current numbers (production, recruitment, current availability, migration, entry-exit)
 - Distributions (public-private, rural-urban, inter-state, gender, category & skill mix)
 - Future projections (supply and demand)

2. What is the HRH status in the country?

- How are these health workers performing?
 - Competency assessment
 - Motivation
 - Task shifting
 - Working conditions

3. Information about HRH policies and policy levers

What are the current policies in existence?

How are they performing? Are they evaluated?

Pre-condition of working in rural/tribal areas for getting promotion
